Nehemiah prayed and fasted to God for four months before petitioning the King to return to his home and reinforce Jerusalem's city walls. Upon arrival into the city, he assessed the damage and got to work. In spite of opposition, he led his people in rebuilding the wall and succeeded.

Gifts in Action in the Bible

In the Gospel of Luke, a parable tells of how a man on the road to Jericho was attacked by robbers and left to die. Both a priest and Levite passed by without helping, but a "certain Samaritan" took pity on the wounded traveler and gave him aid. This story demonstrates how people with compassion seeks to help anyone in need. (Luke 10:30-37)

Barnabas, a respected leader of the early church, was nicknamed "son of encouragement." He traveled with Paul on his first missionary journey. He supported, encouraged, and affirmed Paul when others sought to harm him. When we encourage others, it builds them up to utilize their full potential for ministry.

Her gracious hospitality freed Paul from having to find lodging and preparing meals while doing his mission work. (Acts 16:13-15)

On his first missionary journey, Paul taught and "spoke so effectively" that a large number of Jews and Gentiles started believing in God that day. (Acts 14:1-3)
