
Paint a Footprint – Art

Use the code to help you discover the memory verse for this month.










Ways to Be a Servant - Reflection


Jesus showed the disciples that a good leader is also a good servant. How can you be servant? Write or draw your ideas.

Jesus Washes Feet - John 13:1-17

The Festival of Passover was about to happen, and Jesus was in Jerusalem with his friends, the disciples.

He poured water into a basin for washing and began to wash his disciples' feet.


The disciples thought this was strange.
