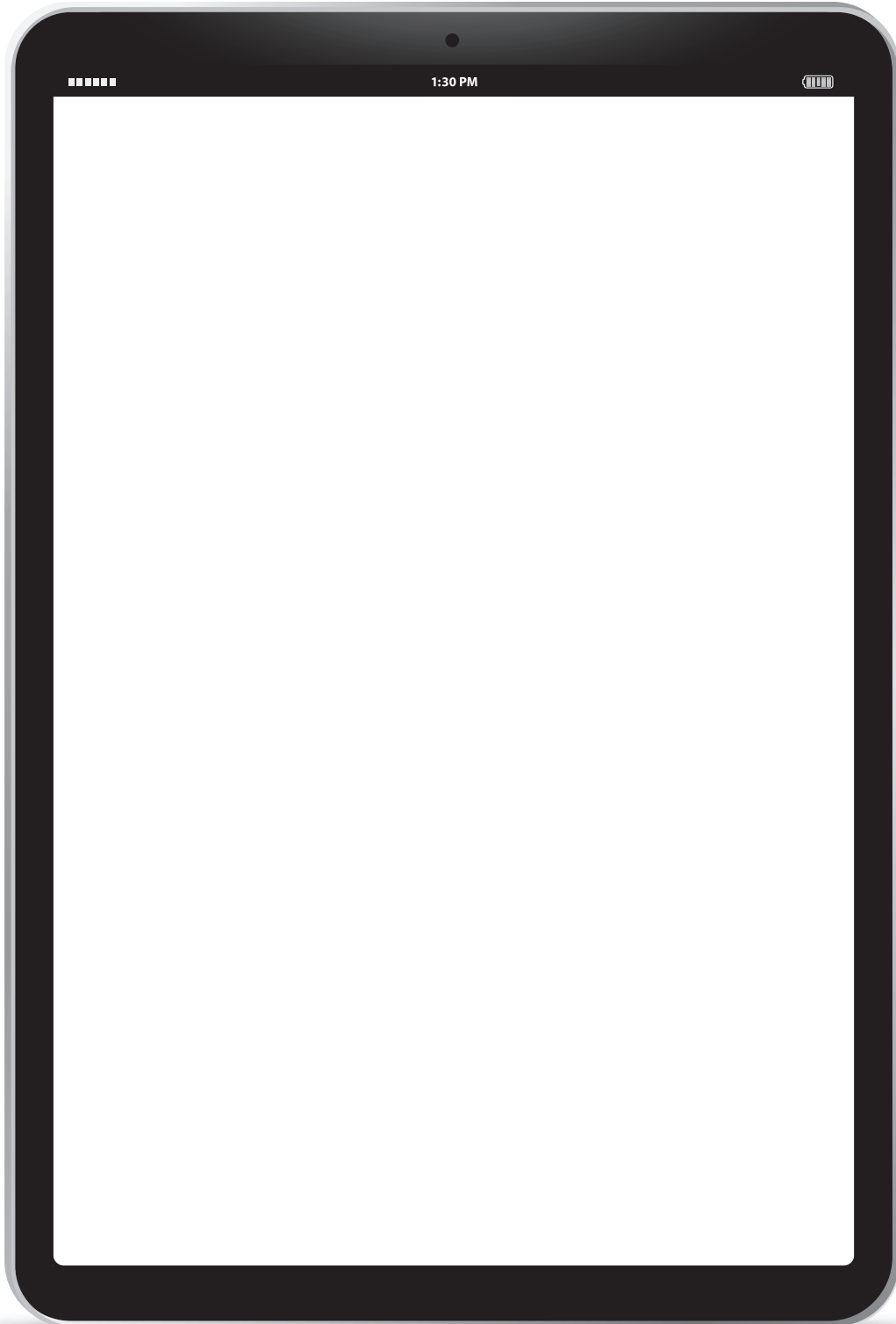
Color the images that remind us of Easter and Holy Week. Cut out the images, punch out the hole, and use string to attach them to your mobile.

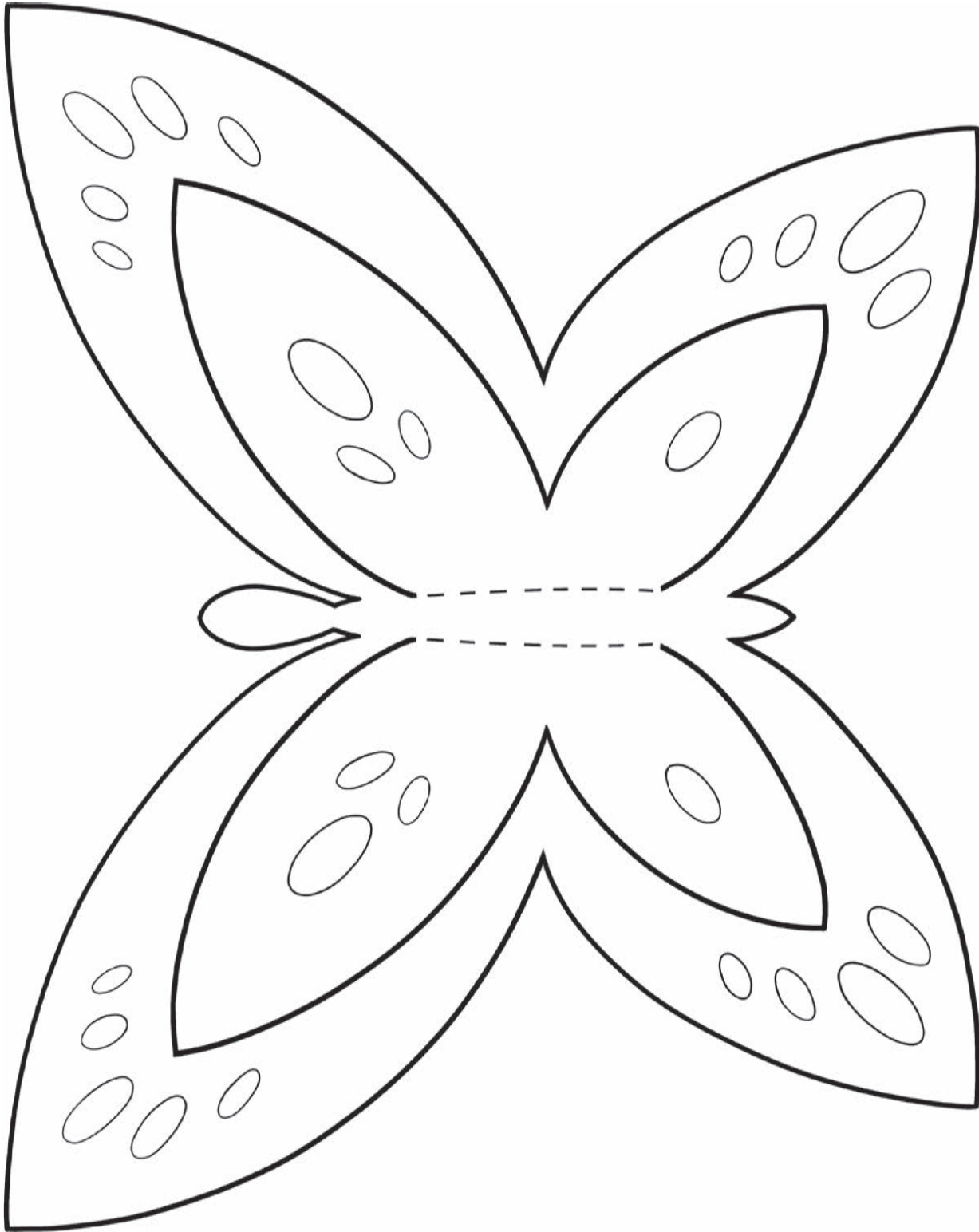
Imagine Jesus' resurrection happened today. Would it go viral? Create a blog or social media post to show how you would share what happened.

3-D Butterfly – Craft

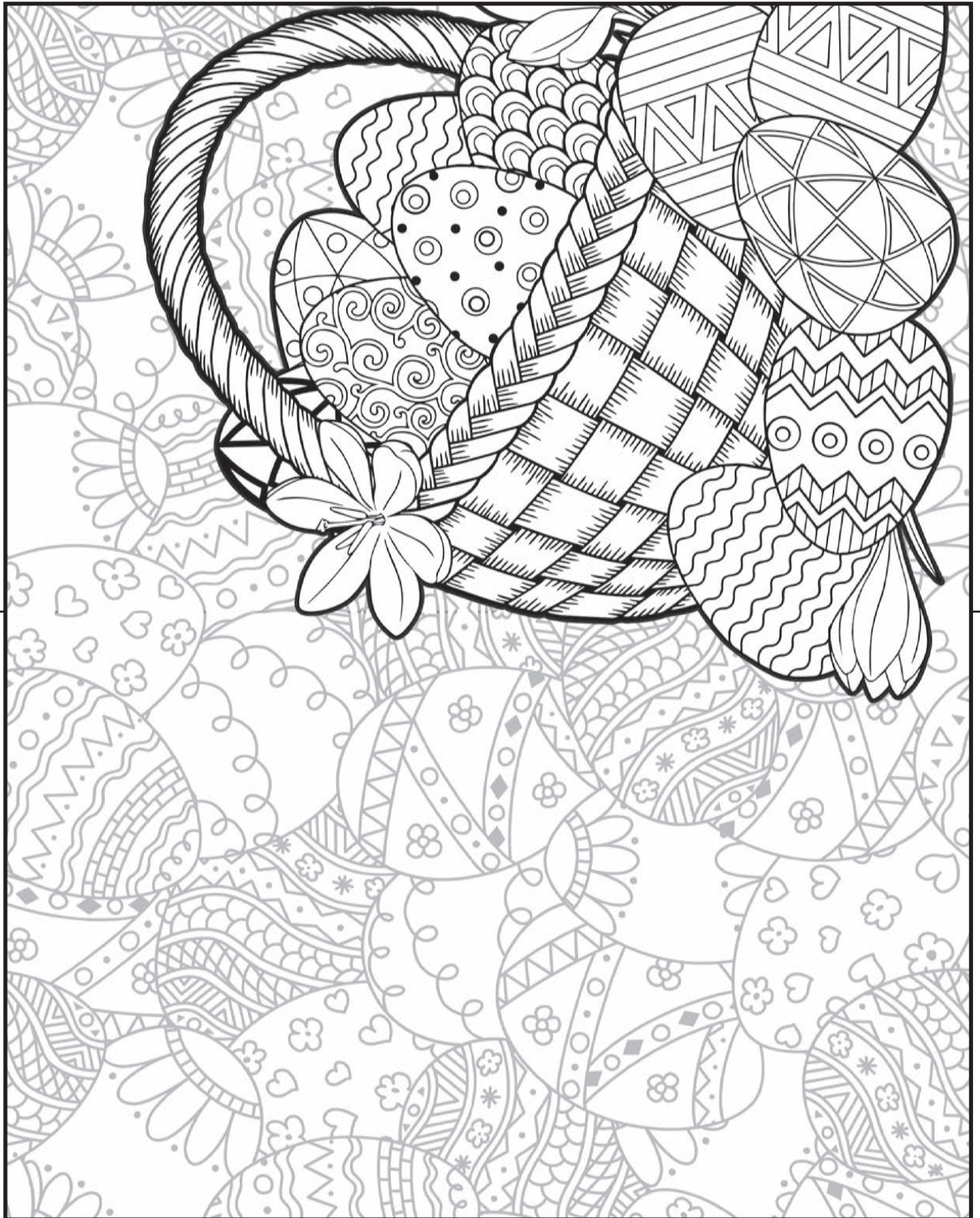

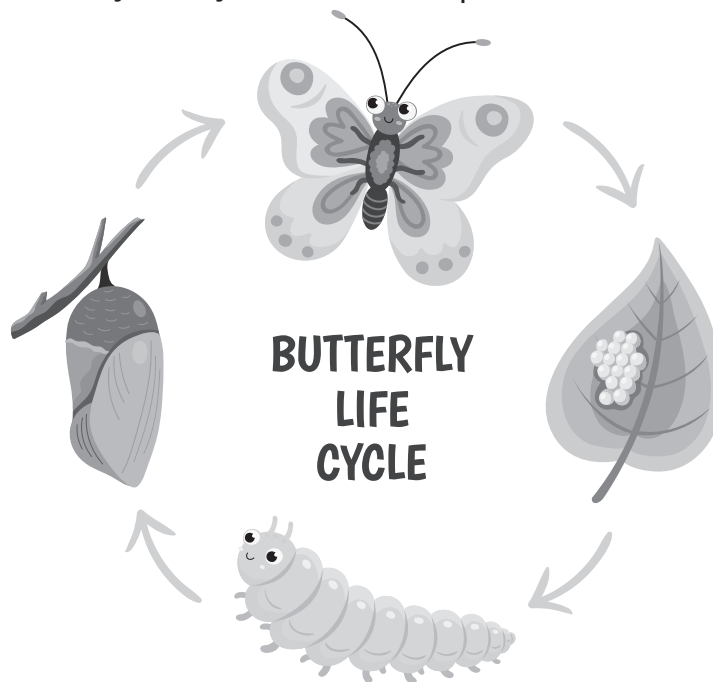

Butterfly Facts – At-Home Activity

Butterflies are a symbol of Easter because they represent new life. Read the butterfly facts and share with your family.

- Butterflies are insects.
- A butterfly's life cycle is made up of four parts: egg, larva (caterpillar), pupa (chrysalis), and adult (butterfly).
- A fully-grown caterpillar attaches itself to a twig or leaf before shedding its outside layer of skin to show the hard skin underneath, which is known as a chrysalis. A butterfly will come out of the chrysalis.
- Butterflies have four wings.
- Butterflies often have brightly-colored wings with patterns made up of tiny scales.
- Butterflies flap their wings about five times every second.
- Butterflies can see the colors green, red, and yellow.
- Most butterflies feed on nectar from flowers.
- Butterflies can taste through their feet.
- Scientists think there are between 15,000 and 20,000 different species of butterfly.
- The fastest a butterfly can fly is twelve miles per hour.
